Cracked Leg Tubes

Recently we have reevaluated the requirements for leg replacements due to cracks in the area of the mounting plate where joined to the leg tube.

Based on our recent evaluation, minor cracks between the leg tube and the leg mounting plate can be re-welded and do not require the replacement of the affected landing leg. Examples of repairable damage are included below.

When determining whether or not to authorize repairs or replacement of a leg due to cracks in the mounting plate area please consider the following

Cracks to the weld are repairable provided:

- The base metal of either the leg tube or the mounting plate is not torn
- The damage is limited to stress fractures and is not accompanied by bending of either the leg tube or the mounting plate.

If either the leg tube or the mounting plate is torn in any way the leg must be replaced.
